On Wednesday, Nobles started arriving and checking into the different hotels throughout Des Moines and West Des Moines. That night friendships were rekindled and new ones formed either during dinner or at the different hospitalities that ran to the earlier morning hours. For some like the CSSA Officers/Past Presidents, and Divan members from the different Temples it was during their Counterpart Dinners.

Thursday was the first full day of activities, mostly meeting by the different associations during the Fall Ceremonial. In the morning things started off with the Market Place opening for patrons to purchase items from the different vendors. The annual Golf Tournament was held at the Top Golf. The Provost Marshal units held their Sporting Clay & Trap Shooting Competition, Provost Pistol (Non-Trap) Competition, and the Provost Balloon Shoot which was followed by conducting their annual meeting. The Central States Shrine Legion of Honor (CSS-LOH) started the day by performing their annual Necrology Report ceremony recognizing the departed members throughout the year. This was followed by CSS-LOH having their annual meeting and installation of officers where Noble Sam Burnett was installed as the Commander for 2025-2026 year. Thanks go out to the Imperial Officers, the CSSA Officer line, and the Kaaba Divan members who came to the Installation and Changing of Command Ceremony. While these activities were taking place the ladies had their Ladies Luncheon at the Host Hotel (Sheraton-West, West Des Moines). The afternoon hours saw more meetings taking place by the Parade Marshal's Chief of Staff Meeting, the Central States Association of Shrine Motor Corps (CSASMC) business meeting, and the Central States Shrine Clown Association (CSSCA) business meeting with their Balloon competition following. After the completion of all meetings scheduled for Thursday, it was time for some serious socializing at the Parking Lot Party held at the Za-Ga-Zig Temple. The Parking Lot Party offered everyone in attendance some excellent entertainment by a local band, good food provided by the Nobles of Za-Ga-Zig, and great fellowship to go around.

Friday was the day for all the competitions to take place. The Keystone Kops held their competition at the Za-Ga-Zig Temple, while the Motor Corps was across the street at the Prairie Meadows Casino Parking Lot except for the Drone Competition at the Temple, the Foot Patrol Competition was at the Saydel School, and the Provost Sporting Clay & Trap Shooters Competition was at the Pioneer Gun Club. During the evening these associations held their Banquets and presented their awards. During the banquet for the Motor Corps, Kaaba received two different trophies from the competition that was held earlier. Noble Jim Goetsch received 2nd Place in the Car Show Special Category event and the following Nobles: Sam Burnett, Tom Hansen, Tom Hodges, Merle McClain, and our Potentate Nate Stone received 1st Place in the Obstacle Course Multi-Wheel Small.

Saturday being the last day of scheduled activities for the Fall Ceremonial saw Nobel's and their Ladies doing last minute shopping at the Market Place. The major event of the day was the annual Shriners Parade held in West Des Moines by the Valley Stadium. This year Kaaba was near the front of the parade being the third Temple in line. Beside the Kaaba Nobles, the Nobles from the other temples all enjoyed themselves making the parade on lookers being amused with all the different variety of Shrine vehicles and parade units that were in attendance. After the parade Za-Ga-Zig hosted the after-parade celebration in the Valley Stadium parking lot. That evening there were a few remaining association banquets to be held by the Keystone Kops, the CSSCA Clowns, and the Mounted Patrol. Hospital Notes from Shriners Children's Chicago, 26 August 2025.

Chicago statistics for July 2025 are: Surgeries: 135 of which 12 were spine. On-site visits number was 1,829. New patients were 228. Discharges were 54 with 52 new admissions. New examinations were 228. Rehabilitation saw 1,875. Telehealth saw an increase of 40 patients using this means of contacting their doctors instead of those patients having to come to the hospital.

The Chicago Hospital has lost 4 employees during the month of July, 2025, with a turnover rate of 1.1%. At the present time we have 380 employees on staff.

Marketing and Communication is promoting Pediatric Fracture and Injury in the Chicago area. A new outreach clinic is being looked into that is centralized within a five plus miles radius of the Chicago Hospital. When looking at a map of where patients are coming from within that 5 miles radius then a clinic would make their travel and convenience a positive means for both the patient and a way to reduce the overall workload on the main Hospital campus a possibility.

Patients Acquisition and Injury data from Facebook or Instagram: During the months of January to July 2025 Chicago received 9 phone calls from the Davenport area during which 8 requests for appointments were made. We do not know if these requests for appointments were also requests for transportation, since that request goes thru the KAABA office only.

Our plant and facilities are doing a good job in maintaining the building and grounds. On-going projects include the 2025 Capital Improvements and are either close to completion or awaiting approval from Tampa. The play lot, rear stairs, landing sidewalk, retaining wall and two patio decks were completed at a cost of \$38K. The exterior signage capital request is in Tampa for legal review. Security camera replacements need upgrading to capture what happens around the hospital and parking lot. We, at times, have individuals enter the grounds and the present camera systems in the 360 fisheye system cannot zoom out to clearly see what they look like. Therefore, the need is to upgrade the current system and is expected to cost around \$210K to install and make operational. All the elevators within the building are 25 to 48 years old and all will require comprehensive modernization soon. This is expected to cost over 1 million dollars to complete. The play lot patio and sidewalk replacement are estimated to cost over \$88K.

Clinic and IPU (Impatient Units) roof replacement is past due. The roof is over 25 years old and showing signs of cracking and repairs on roof are not binding together to stop leaking. Inspection has noted that it has outlasted its useful life. A core sampling process will be used to sample how to make the correct improvements and replacement. Also, boiler and feed water tank replacement are required with a new larger tank that can separate low- and high-pressure systems. The present tank is rated at 440HP and the required size should be 660HP. This suggested size would require the tank to be moved 90 degrees in place so that maintenance can be performed all around the boiler room safety. This procedure will require complete shut-down of the hospital heating and cooling system for a period of at least 48 hours.

The new MRI/CT preparation is under way. The expected delivery is by early December 2025 and be operational by early in 2026. The location will be in the old laundry room.

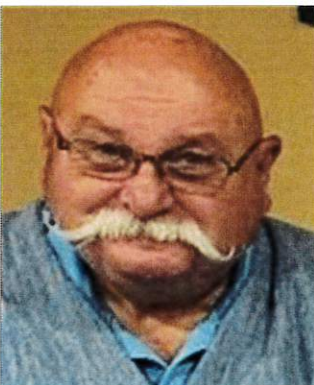
Charles H. Frymoyer June 23, 2025

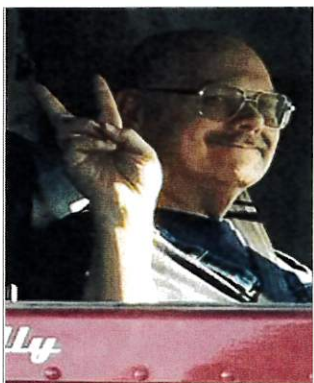
Terrance "Terry" Riessen July 8, 2025

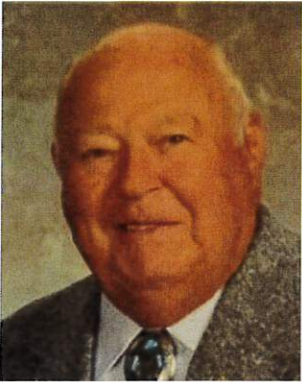
David Cassat July 22, 2025
